

# Board Messages

Executive Offector Todd Thronson

As I start my 13th season with Snowmobile North Dakota, I reflect on how things have changed and yet remain the same. We face many of the same challenges as in the past but also look forward to what technology will bring to be used to accomplish our mission. The work at SND is always interesting to be sure. It is hard to believe it is also the start of my 3rd season as the Executive Director. My how time flies!

As we look back on the 2016-2017 season, it feels good to state that we at least had a normal to above normal snow year. We were able to groom in some areas that had not seen action in 5 years. Some of the normal snow areas were left short however. Much of the state trails with water areas to cross struggled with thin and unsafe ice issues do to early snow before freeze up.

This past season we were set to start using the groomer gps tracking system with Automated Logistic Systems. We were able to provide a link on the website which showed which trails had recently been groomed. We are working on integrating the record keeping features of the tracking system. The company does have some updates and improvements coming as well.

Snowmobile North Dakota is so fortunate to have the involvement of so many awesome volunteers across the state. Although we are always in need of more help and involvement, we always seem to have those core people that year after year step up and take care of what needs to be done. Without these key people, we would not be able to move forward. Again, I sincerely thank them all.

I had the pleasure again to attend the International Snowmobile Congress (ISC) which was in Winnipeg, MB in June. I participated meetings many fellow administrators and had discussions with other states regarding how they manage their trail programs. Very interesting to visit with other people that deal with many of the same challenges

and hurdles as we do in our program. I came away from the conference with reviewed insight from fellow administrators. I look forward to attending again in the future.

Although our registration numbers are down this past year, our revenue was up 12.8 per cent due to the increase in registration fees and gas tax rate. The cost to register a snowmobile was raised from \$40.00 every two years to \$50.00 for two years. This has helped balance things even with the low registration numbers. We had good snow in many areas this past season and are surely hoping for snow this coming season to get our numbers and interest up.

SND looks forward to the future as we constantly grow to incorporate new technologies, funding sources and other resources. We need to remember SND's vision: "to generate excitement for the sport of snowmobiling!"

The physical classes cost \$20 and typically run for 4 hours with a test during the last hour. If any parent or local club is interested in scheduling a class, you can call (701) 328-5348. A big thank you to the local snowmobile clubs, they have done an amazing job hosting these classes throughout the years.
